# Native It's Your Game! A Healthy Life Skills Curriculum

## Fall 2017 Update

We would like to thank everyone who participated in *Native It's Your Game* (Native IYG)! The Native IYG project was a collaboration between the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona, Inc., the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board, and the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston to adapt and evaluate a sexual health curriculum for Alaska Native and American Indian middle school students.



The goal of the project is to give youth the information and tools needed to make healthy decisions about healthy friendships and relationships, how to handle peer pressure, how to prevent unplanned pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections, and the facts about substance abuse.

#### Who participated?

- 574 youth enrolled in the study
- 523 youth took a pre-survey, 402 youth took an immediate follow up survey, and 370 took a 2<sup>nd</sup> follow up survey a year after going through the program
- Average age = 13
- 53% female

#### **Study Update**



#### What did we learn?

- Parents are important! Helping youth avoid risky situations, alcohol, and making the decision to wait means they are less likely to have sex at an early age.
- Youth who went through the Native IYG program had more reasons not to have sex, gained knowledge about STIs and condoms, and they felt more confident about getting and using condoms if they chose to have sex.
- A year after going through the Native IYG program, youth reported that they would be more likely to seek education beyond high school, retained knowledge about condoms, and continued to feel more confident about getting and using condoms if they chose to have sex.
