WHO?

Educators, providers, school staff, and community organizers and others who are involved in the planning and implementation of sexual health curricula in AI/AN communities.

WHAT?

The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston (UTHealth) School of Public Health, the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC), the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona, Inc. (ITCA), and the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board (NPAIHB) have developed the **HNY Implementation Toolbox**, a free web-based tool to help organizations adopt, implement, and maintain culturally relevant sexual health education programs for AI/AN communities.

TIME COMMITMENT

- The HNY Implementation Toolbox User Experience study happens online at a time and location that is most convenient to you.
- We will ask you to use the HNY Implementation Toolbox website over a period of 6 months. During this time, you will be asked to fill out 2 online surveys that will take about 10-20 minutes each. If you are interested, we will also invite you to share your experience using the HNY Implementation Toolbox at our online HNY Community of Practice sessions.
- You will receive an electronic gift card for each survey completed.
